Credit allocation. In ECTS 60 credits are attached to the learning outcomes and associated workload of a typical full time year of formal learning (an academic year) and 30 credits are attached to a semester. Current surveys suggest that the European average workload is between 1500 to 1800 hours for an academic year.

The purpose of the Ad-Hoc Working Group was to prepare a revised version of the ECTS Users' Guide by mid-2014, by reflecting on policy development and implementation in the area of ECTS and learning outcomes since the previous revision of the ECTS Users' Guide in 2009.

European Higher Education Area and Bologna Process

The ECTS User Guide states that institutions should "use the credits gained abroad for accumulation purposes to satisfy specific curricular requirements, as previously agreed in the Learning Agreement; recognising credits gained abroad as additional credits would not fulfil the commitment to full academic recognition".⁴
